

TUITION AND FEES

All registration charges are to be paid before the start of each class. Payments made after that time will be assessed a late fee of \$10. Credits in any combination for Summer College (Full Term, First Half Term, Second Half Term) will be charged at the following rate:

UNDERGRADUATE

First 8 credit hours.....\$305 per credit hour
9th credit hour and above\$458 per credit hour

GRADUATE

First 8 credit hours\$370 per credit hour
9th credit hour and above\$555 per credit hour

OTHER CREDIT

13 music lessons (30 or 50 min.)..... \$340
(If taken for credit, credit hour charges are in addition to music lesson fee.)
Auditing fee.....\$153 per credit hour

FINANCIAL AID

The primary form of financial aid for Summer College is the Federal Stafford Loan Program for eligible students. There may be individual cases in which students will qualify for a Federal Pell Grant or a Federal Perkins Loan. WITHDRAWAL AND REFUND POLICY

Reducing Credit Hours:

Students who reduce their credit hours, but remain enrolled in Summer College, may be eligible for limited refunds of tuition. Students must file an official written notice with the Registrar=s Office. The date on which this written request is received by the Registrar=s Office will be used in calculating any refunds.

Withdrawing from the College:

The federal government has developed specific regulations and policies which must be followed in calculating refunds. These apply both to students who officially withdraw from the college and to students who withdraw from the college unofficially.

The specific dates for refunds and the percent of charges to be refunded may be obtained from the Business Office at 274-4109.
