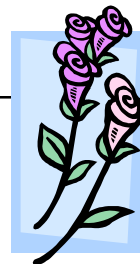
If you are visiting Our Savior's for the first time, please sign the guest book in the Lobby and pick up a bar of fair-traded chocolate, our gift to you.
