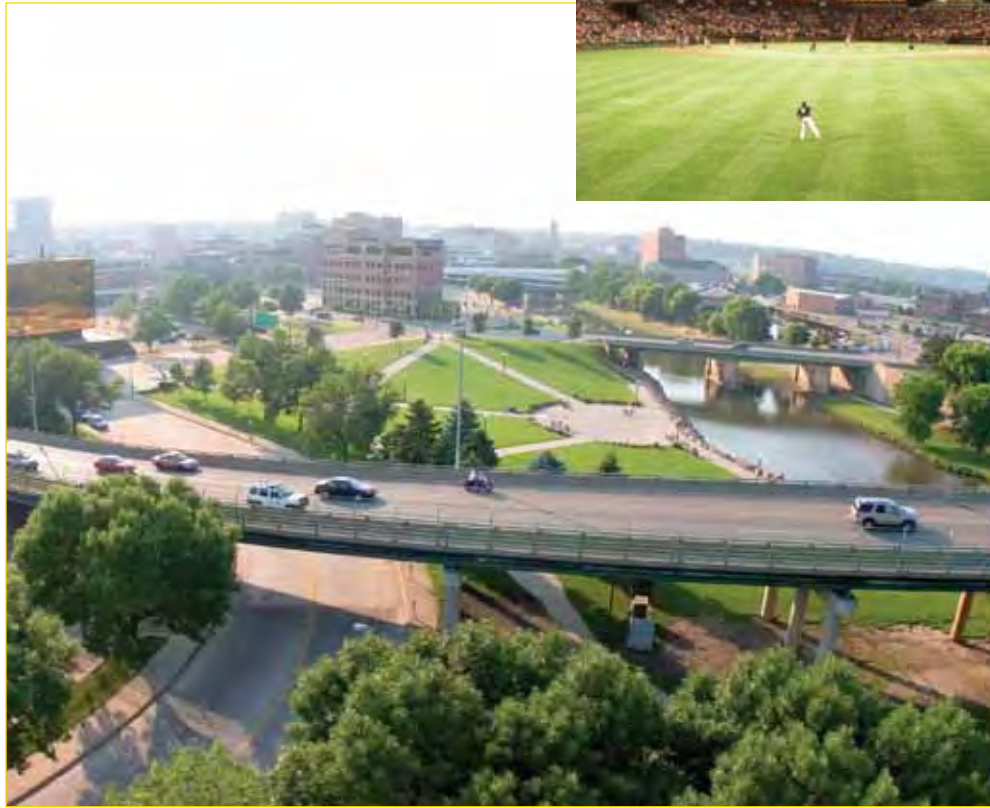
## Our Hometown

## Ten Things You Probably Don't Know About Sioux Falls

1. On average there are 230 sunny days per year in Sioux Falls.
2. Sioux Falls offers over 500 options for dining out, ranging from locally owned cafés to national chains.
3. For seven consecutive years, *Forbes* ranked Sioux Falls the #1 Best Small Metro for Business & Careers.
4. Sioux Falls, home to four minor league teams, was named by *Sports Business Journal* the 9th best minor league sports market in the nation.
5. Sioux Falls is home to the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra, which was started by Augustana in 1922.
6. Sioux Falls has over 80 parks and recreation areas and a 20-mile paved loop following the Big Sioux River around the city.
7. Sioux Falls is nationally recognized as the best center of health resources between Denver and the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota.
8. Over 14 million people visit Sioux Falls' Empire Mall each year, only minutes away from the Augustana campus.
9. There are 47 languages spoken in the Sioux Falls School District.
10. The Washington Pavilion of Arts and Science has played host to touring Broadway shows such as "Hairspray," "The Producers," "Cats," "Chicago," "Cabaret," and "Rent"; musicians Yo-Yo Ma, Indigo Girls, Harry Connick, Jr., Ben Folds, and The New York Philharmonic; and comedians Bill Cosby and Jerry Seinfeld.

Sioux Falls offers students a long list of excuses to put down the books for a while. Spontaneous trips to Suburban Bowl for 50-cent bowling or escapes to the nearby Empire Mall are not uncommon. Nearby recreation areas offer skiing, camping, mountain biking, hiking, and canoeing. Sioux Falls' dynamic economy also provides students access to internships with leading-edge employers in the health care, financial services, agribusiness, trade, high-tech manufacturing, and retail industries.

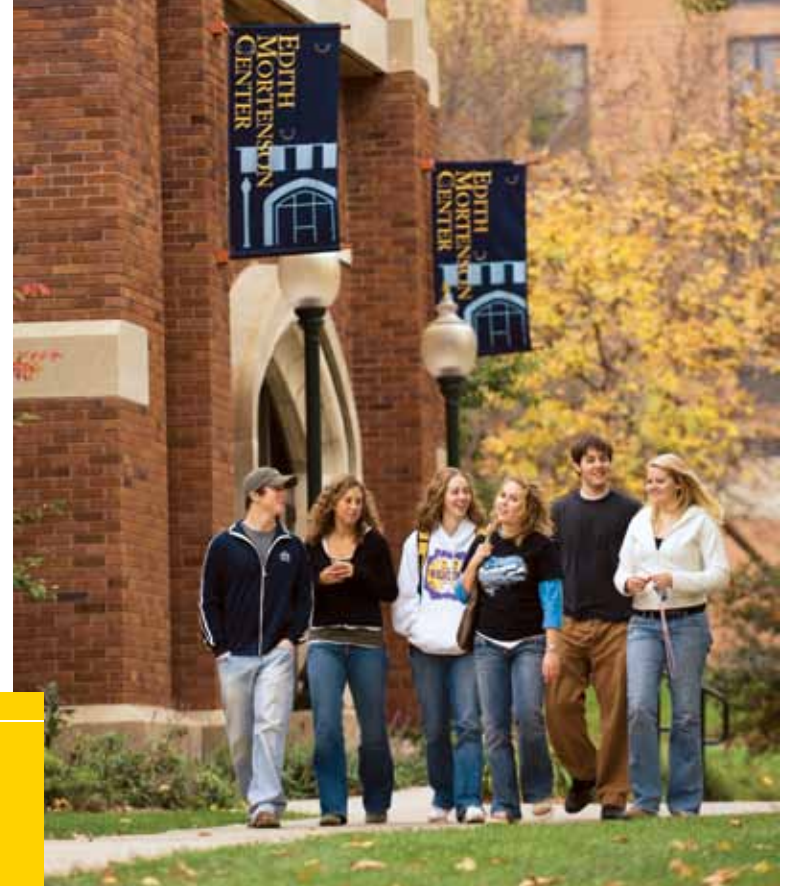

## In Brief

### FOUNDED

Founded in 1860, Augustana is a selective, private, residential, comprehensive college (liberal arts and professional) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

### LOCATION

Sioux Falls, a city of 151,000

### CAMPUS

Located in a residential area, Augustana's beautifully maintained, tree-lined campus covers 100 acres.

### FACULTY

Augustana's 116 full-time tenured and tenure-track faculty are passionate about their discipline and about their teaching. Outside of the classroom, they serve as mentors and advisors.

### STUDENTS

1,725 full- and part-time students come to Augustana from 28 states and 14 countries.

### RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Affirming the value of residential living, all first-, second-, and third-year students reside in campus housing. Living opportunities include residence halls, theme houses, and apartments. Ninety-five percent of first-year students and 80 percent of second-year students live on campus. The College offers 6 residence halls, 3 apartment complexes, and 15 theme houses. All first-year students live in Bergsaker or Solberg Hall.

### CALENDAR

The College is on a 4-1-4 academic calendar: fall and spring semesters with a January interim. There are also two summer sessions.

### SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

Over \$33 million in scholarships and financial aid is awarded on the basis of need, merit, and/or talent.

### INTERNSHIPS AND PART-TIME JOBS

Internships are abundant and include opportunities in a variety of business, health care, governmental and non-profit settings. Augustana's location in Sioux Falls also presents numerous options for parttime employment.

### LIBRARY RESOURCES

Mikkelsen Library contains 250,000 bound volumes and provides access to nearly 3,000,000 additional volumes via the South Dakota Library Network.

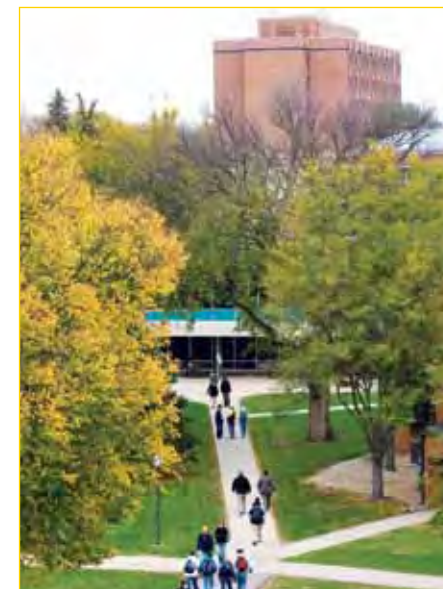

## Directions from I-29

Exit east on 41st Street. Take 41st Street to Kiwanis Avenue (1 mile). Turn left on Kiwanis and drive north to 33rd Street (.5 mile). Turn right on 33rd and drive east to Summit Avenue (1.2 miles). Turn left on Summit. The visitor lot is two blocks on the right. The Office of Admission is located in the Administration Building.

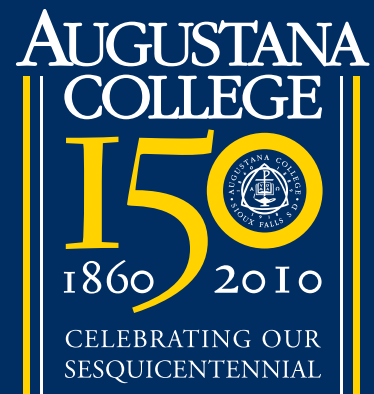
