New Technology: Can't We Just Make Up the Signs?

Are you easily stumped by technological jargon? This course will be focused on techniques to sign technology related vocabulary properly. An emphasis will be put on conceptual accuracy in technology based interpreting settings.

Understanding Technology Signs

Do you typically rely on fingerspelling to convey technological concepts? Do you ever feel like you are speaking nonsense while interpreting in IT settings? This course will provide greater understanding of technology related terms, their meanings and functions based on layman's terms.
