Pamela Miller was our Director of Sustainability until August and is responsible for our solid foundation.

So far, our team has: hosted a successful Earth Day event, sent out a sustainability survey for on-campus students that generated a 43% response rate, created a website (*click here*), established social media accounts (follow us!), and began this

monthly newsletter.

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: DR. CRAIG SPENCER (BIOLOGY)

Have you ever stopped to think about where your grass came from? A few years ago, Dr. Craig Spencer converted his yard from Kentucky bluegrass, native to Europe and Asia, to native prairie plants. They do not need water or fertilizer—and, of course, they are local.

Dr. Craig bikes or walks to work. He also pays close attention to where the limited meat that he eats comes from. He encourages others to experiment with Meatless Mondays.

"We have finite resources on Earth," Dr. Craig said. "It makes sense that we should try to live sustainably and not over-deplete these resources; thereby leaving a better legacy for future generations."

Can't take the course but still want to help? Check out Sharing the Dream, a store in downtown Sioux Falls that sells the Guatemalan jewelry, handbags, and more!



DATA UPDATE—AND WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP IMPROVE THESE NUMBERS!

Electricity




For a while, there was an upward trend in electricity usage leading to a peak of just over 400 kwh per student in 2015. Since then, the consumption levels have been steadily decreasing. The more conscious students are of their consuming habits, the more efficient campus will become in its energy usage.

Gas

Campus uses an average of 10,234 CCF per month. CCF is the volume of gas used, and the abbreviation means 100 cubic feet of gas. There is an increase in gas consumption during the winter season because of heating. Natural gas represents a big portion of our campus's energy consumption. Using heating responsibly during winter and making sure to insulate the room can prevent heat from escaping and lower our gas usage.

PaperCut

During the period of August 30, 2017 to May 18, 2018, 1,768 students printed a total of 1,331,928 pages on 31 printers around campus. **That is an average of 5,083 pages per day.** This amount of printing equals 3,961.3 kg of CO2 production or 249,412.7 hours of a running light bulb. 32.18% of students print single-sided, which means a large amount of paper is being wasted. If more students **print double-sided**, we could see a big decrease in our paper consumption.



This graph examines how water usage is affected by the number of students. We can see that the relationship is not the strongest but it's definitely there. We can also see that the water consumption levels have been fairly stable over the years, which shows that there's a lot of room to lower them.
