With the permission of the LALC chair, other modern languages not offered in the Department of Languages, Literatures and Cultures may be approved for the Languages major or minor.

○ MAJOR

A required minimum of 37 credit hours, including:

- 22 credit hours in a one language offered in the Dept. of Languages, Literatures and Cultures, including either 320 or 321
- 12 credit hours in a second LALC language
- Majors who enter the program at the 300 (advanced) level must complete a minimum of 10 credits hours from courses offered in the department including either 320 or 321
- Majors who meet eligibility requirements have the option to complete a one-credit Honor's Thesis (400). Students planning to pursue graduate studies and who meet eligibility requirements are especially encouraged to complete a Honor's Thesis.

○ MINOR

A required minimum of 27 credits hours, including:

- 16 credit hours in a one language offered in the Dept. of Languages, Literatures and Cultures, including either 320 or 321
- 6 credit hours in a second LALC languages
- Minors who enter the program at the 300 (advanced) level must complete a minimum of 7 credits hours from courses offered in the department including either 320 or 321

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| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete 124 credit hours with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0. 2. The last 30 credit hours must be taken at Augustana. 3. No more than 3 workshop credit hours may count toward the 124 credit hour requirement. 4. Complete the requirements for one major. 5. Complete the core curriculum–SOPHIA–requirements). No more than 10 credit hours from any one prefix (e.g. ENGL, FREN, SPAN, etc.) may count toward meeting the core curriculum. 6. Students will complete two courses with an integrated writing component, designated by a (W). In addition, students will complete one Communication (C) course as well as one Ethics (E) course. LALC majors may use both 320 (W) and 321 (W) to satisfy their 2 W component requirement. 7. Only language courses for which students earn a C- will count toward the <i>minimum</i> number of credits required for the major. 8.
