What is an adult-geriatric acute care nurse practitioner (AG-ACNP)?

The AG-ACNP specializes in caring for patients ages 13 and older with complex acute and chronic medical conditions in the inpatient health care setting.

What is an adult-geriatric clinical nurse specialist (AG-CNS)?

The AG-CNS is a clinical practice expert, educator, researcher and consultant who influences the three spheres of practice: patient care, nursing and systems.
