WHY STUDY NURSING?

The mission of the Department of Nursing at Augustana is to prepare transformational leaders who practice in interprofessional environments. Graduates are poised to collaboratively address complex issues in an evolving health care environment through experiences that cultivate their personal, intellectual and professional growth. The nursing program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). Graduates are eligible to take the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Licensing Examination (NCLEX) for licensure as registered nurses. They are prepared for entrylevel positions anywhere in the health care system, and they have a strong foundation for graduate study.

Top 10% of the class will be asked to join the Zeta Zeta chapter of Sigma Theta Tau Honor Society. Apply to be a senior nursing mentor. During J-Term, complete preceptorship hours in Sioux Falls or join a faculty-led trip to Norway or Ecuador.
