

The conceptual framework for the Teacher Education Program is grounded in a philosophy that integrates the best of Western educational thought, wisdom of indigenous Native American culture and emerging research on positive youth development. Known as the Circle of Courage, this conceptual framework empowers teacher candidates with the knowledge, skills and dispositions to create positive learning environments so that all students can learn. Throughout their program of study, teacher candidates complete course requirements and participate in field experiences designed to facilitate mastery and understanding of the program competencies.
